ICONIC LANDMARKS

Start with the Praça da Liberdade, a palm-lined square surrounded by museums and historic buildings. Visit the Church of São Francisco de Assis at Pampulha, a modernist architectural gem designed by Oscar Niemeyer—one of Brazil's most photographed spots.



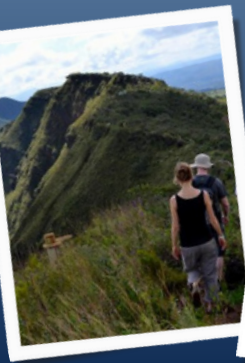
SOCCER CULTURE & STADIUM TOURS

For city views, head to Mirante Mangabeiras, where you'll get sweeping vistas of BH and the surrounding mountains. Love nature? Visit Parque das Mangabeiras, one of Brazil's largest urban parks, or take a short trip to Serra do Curral for hiking and epic sunsets.



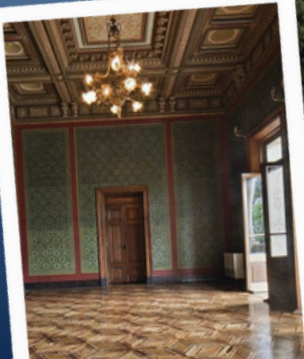
LOCAL FLAVORS & STREET FOOD
